Welcome to the Website of the AAP Section for Senior Members

Welcome, and please “Bookmark” our new website as your Home Page on the web. The new website is a collaborative pilot project between the AAP Section for Senior Members and the American Academy of Pediatrics. The Section for Senior Members website consists of the Home Page (just visited by you) and a number of different sections containing articles and links to interesting websites in that topic area. The Section for Senior Members wishes to thank Jaymes Nauta (AAP) and Amy Beschta-Newborn (AAP), and Section for Senior Members Webmaster Jerold M. Aronson MD FAAP for their wonderful efforts on our behalf.

Navigating the Home Page at the Website:

Let’s explore the website. When you login, you are on the Section for Senior Members Home Page. Notice the organization of the Home Page. The Home Page consists of: i) a Site Map on the right panel of the page that provides one-click linkage with Sections containing in-depth articles and content on specific topics; ii) the standard AAP header that allows one-click connection with individual sections on the AAP (www.aap.org) webpage; iii) contact information about current members of the Section Executive Committee and the Editors and Contributors to the Senior Bulletin; and “What’s New”. Periodically, one-click linkage with specific events, e.g. AAP NCE information will be available on the Home Page as well as located in the Upcoming Events section. Note - if the font/text size on the page is not right for you, you can adjust the font/text size by clicking on your choice of font/text size (Large, Medium, Small) in the upper left corner of the Home Page or any Section Page.

View the “What’s New” section on the Home Page. “What’s New” highlights “Breaking News” and provides one-click linkage with detailed information about the topic. “What’s New” titles that have articles and/or websites linked to them are highlighted in **blue**. To view an article, roll and place your mouse pointer over the Title of the article. Notice how the article Title becomes **bold and black** to make it easier to read. Click on the Title of any article in this area with your mouse to view the complete article. The most recent issue of the Section for Senior Members Senior Bulletin may also be viewed at “What’s New”.

Explore the rest of the Home Page. The pictures on the Home Page “tell a story” of the variety of activities in which our members are engaged from work and volunteering to personal self-development/hobbies and “play”. Enjoy how the Senior Member picture changes each time you return to the site. See if you can identify the pictures. We welcome any “story pictures” of yourself that illustrate

ways in which you are currently serving children and/or your community. Please contact [Jerold M. Aronson MD FAAP \(Webmaster\)](#) for more information, or to send a picture via an email attachment. Finally, the Home Page has a standard AAP Search function. Are you looking for something specific, either within our Section website or the AAP website? To locate a specific item, policy statement, standard, etc., type in the search term in Search, then click on the arrow to the right to search the website. A list of potential articles that meet your search request will appear.

We plan to use the existing Section for Senior Members listserv to periodically inform you of changes at the website. If your email address is not currently listed with the AAP, click on E - mail List and provide us with your e-mail address. We promise not to “spam” you with excess e-mail for your In-Box.

Navigating individual Section Pages:

On the Home Page, notice the Site Menu of quick-link section buttons to the right of “What’s New”. A single click of your mouse takes you to a section that contains content on a specific topic. For example, “About Us” includes a Welcome Letter from Dr. Katcher (Chairperson of the Section), information about the Section, and links to our Section Membership Application. One can also pay your dues from “About Us” via a secure AAP website.

Each section page is organized in a “bulleted” outline format. Under each “bullet” will be the Title and a brief synopsis of the article. Click on the Title of the article to view the article. Remember, [blue](#) color is the reminder that either content or a web address (URL) – hyperlink is present. Click once on the hyperlink to go to the website to which the content refers. To maximize your viewing experience, each section is limited to 5 subsections for easy viewing. As well, each subsection will display the article Titles for a maximum of 5 articles. However, a subsection may have more than 5 articles. In that case, the user will see a blue highlighted arrow accompanied by text [More](#). Click on [More](#) to open a page with all of the articles in the subsection, including their Title and Synopsis. Click on any Title to read the complete article.

On a Section page, the Site Menu appears at the top of each page to enable you to efficiently navigate the website and get to where you want to go quickly. For example, if you want to return to the website Home Page, one-click on Home at Home in the Site Menu at the top of the page. Orient yourself to the various Sections by using the one-click buttons and learn about the variety of information available to you. For example, find out about activities for Senior Members in your state chapter at Seniors and Chapters. View the Table of Contents for all Senior Bulletin issues or read specific Senior Bulletin issues at Senior Bulletin Archives. Plan your future advocacy and volunteer activities at Opportunities. Learn strategies for health and well being at Living Well and Health & Fitness.

Adobe Reader Software Required:

Since you are reading this article, your computer has Adobe Reader software already installed. However, your copy of Adobe Reader may not be the most current version. Since most articles will appear in “pdf” format, the format easily read by Adobe Reader, we encourage you to update your software. Adobe Reader is a free, software application available for download and upload at www.adobe.com. Upgrade your Adobe Reader today by clicking on the blue hyperlink.
